## 3RD ANNUAL NATIONAL COMPETITION

The 3rd Annual National Competition is to be held at the "Morialta Falls" reserve on Saturday 22nd October, 1983. This will be the first time that these competitions have been held in South Australia. The first two being held at Shepparton, Victoria.

We are anticipating the attendance of most States (including Tasmania who are bringing their ambulance with the assistance of A.N.L.). These competitions provide the ideal environment for an interface with other ambulance services, for exchange of ideas, comparisons of training standards, etc.

The competition itself involves all aspects of ambulance work and includes such components as Driving, treatment of patients, lifting and loading of patients, reporting to medical staff, etc. The competition is restricted to "primary care" ambulance only and the equipment used by each team must be as used in their own particular State.
